In any case, I would be delighted to welcome you all at our Welcome Day on 1st October 2024 and wish you a good start in advance!

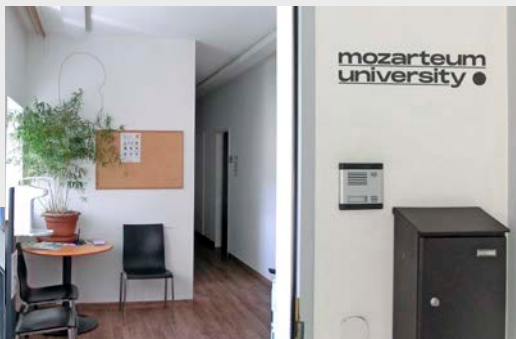

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• Where do I enrol?

From **July to mid-September**, the staff of the Course and Examination Management will be at your disposal in their offices, Makartplatz 5, III. floor.



From **mid-September and during the semester**, counselling and administrative services are provided at the Servicepoint on the ground floor of the main building, Mirabellplatz 1.

After successful enrolment you receive:

Please note: If you pay via telebanking, do not forget to enter your **payment reference, name and student ID!**

Enrolment happens only after on-time payment of the complete amount!

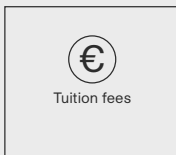

• Payment in the following semesters

In order to continue your registration for the next semester, you must pay the ÖH fee each semester and, if required, the tuition fee.

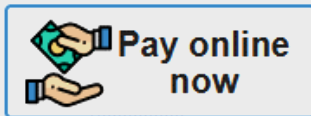
Payments must be made during the general admission period or at the latest during the re-registration period of the semester. Payments after the end of the re-registration period on 31st October for the winter semester and 31st March for the summer semester can no longer be considered.

You will receive the payment details in the first semester when you enrol. From the next semester onwards, you will only find the payment details in MOZonline under Tuition fees.



You can pay the fees via online banking or directly via MOZonline.

- When paying via online banking, please be sure to enter the correct payment reference. ATTENTION: the payment reference changes every semester.
- Payment via MOZonline is only possible from the 2nd semester onwards. To do this, click on „Pay online now“ under Tuition fees and follow the instructions.

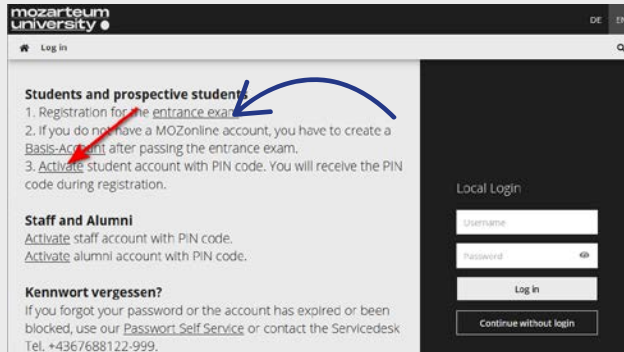

• MOZonline account

Registration with MOZonline via <https://mozonline.moz.ac.at> (student account) possible at the earliest three days after payment of the fee(s); required for this purpose

- PIN code
- Matriculation number (see student ID card)
- Date of birth



Click on „Activate student account with PIN code“, then you can set your own password.

In MOZonline you can:

- register for courses (My Studies)
- change your study and home address (Current/Home Address)
- print study sheets, confirmations of study and confirmations of study period (Enrolment Documents)
- print course certificates and certificates of academic achievements (Transcripts)
- pay the ÖH-fee and tuition fee (Tuition fees)
- access your MOZmail account (Webmail)

MOZmail address

Your MOZonline account also gives you access to your MOZmail address (Outlook). For data protection reasons, please only use the MOZmail address for communication with the university. Check your mailbox regularly. Mails from Mozarteum University will only be sent to the MOZmail address.

• Student ID card



You will receive your student ID card at your enrolment.

After you have activated your MOZonline account, you can validate your student ID card for the current semester. There are machines for this purpose at several locations of Mozarteum University.

When you insert the ID card into the machine, it will be extended until the end of the current semester,

and the „Valid until“ date will be printed on it. PLEASE NOTE: The ID card can only be used from the day after the activation.



Locations of the machines in Salzburg:

- Mirabellplatz EG by the two lifts next to the porter's lodge
- Mozarteum Foundation UG near the photocopier
- Orff Institute EG in the corridor near the photocopier
- KunstWerk EG by the coffee machine in front of the photography

Functions of the ID card:

- booking of practice rooms (see folder “Manual for the Room Reservation System”)
- access to some Mozarteum buildings
- in the University Library as a library card

- The recharging of money for printing and copying on all copying and printing machines at Mozarteum University. The “Moneyloader” is located in the main building, Mirabellplatz 1, next to the porter's lodge and in the Orff Institute, Frohnburgweg 55. Much more practical, however, is cashless recharging via the payment page <https://uniload.moz.ac.at>.

- Mensa discount

In addition, students often get discounts in shops, restaurants, cultural institutions and museums in Salzburg. Whether it's a bar, bakery or cinema: Show your card and ask for a student discount.

Duplicate

To obtain a duplicate of your lost student ID card you must submit a theft or loss report and another photo ID. It is also necessary to pay the duplicate fee of € 15,-. The new student ID card can be picked up at the Servicepoint 3–4 working days after the payment.

• Study planning

A thoughtful planning of semesters and study sections can contribute decisively to the enjoyment of studying, as no deadlines are overlooked, no unnecessary time pressure arises, and a semester or academic year is not unexpectedly „lost“.

- Step 1:** Study the curriculum carefully (e.g. sometimes there are courses that build on another and have to be completed in a specific order). The curriculum including module overview can be downloaded from the website of your degree programme.
- Step 2:** Seek advice (e.g. on the question of whether compulsory courses are offered every semester, only once per academic year or even less frequently). The tutors and departmental secretariats will be happy to help.
- Step 3:** Check the current course offerings in MOZonline.
- Step 4:** Draw up a sensible timetable (with times for rehearsing, studying or writing, but also for the necessary rest, for friends or family, etc.); it is advisable to plan only about 60% of the week as a fixed schedule, to reserve 20% as replacement time for unforeseen events and to leave another 20% completely open.
- Step 5:** Early registration for participation in the desired courses.

• Recognition of examinations/preliminary work

Positively assessed examinations and other academic achievements taken at a recognised post-secondary educational institution as well as activities and qualifications (such as scientific, artistic, and professional activities) are to be recognised pursuant to § 78 UG if there are no significant differences with regard to the competences acquired.

Recommendation: Submit your academic achievements for recognition as soon as possible. It makes it much easier to plan your further studies.

It takes 6–8 weeks to check the documents, clarify the situation and to issue the notification of recognition. Notification is made via MOZmail address, and the decision is also stored in the student file in MOZonline.

In addition to compulsory subjects and electives, you can also register for a selection of free electives (FWF).

Click on the desired course. If there is more than one teacher to choose from, select the desired teacher and register yourself.

For the view of the individual semesters, it is recommended to switch from the „Study plan“ to the „Semester plan“ view.

• Practice rooms

Students are credited a weekly time quota which can be used to reserve practice rooms at <https://raumreservierung@moz.ac.at>. Room reservations are only possible if the student ID has already been validated for the current semester.

Reserved rooms can be unlocked with the student ID card. If a reserved room is not unlocked within 15 minutes of the start of the reservation, the room will be released for other students.

• Library

Holdings / locations / borrowing titles

The library has a total stock of ~300,000 media (~170,000 sheet music, ~115,000 books, ~15,000 audio-visual media (CD, DVD etc.) and ~280 current periodicals) covering the range of subjects represented at the university.

The holdings are divided between the main library and the individual sub-libraries:

- Main library (Salzburg, Mirabellplatz 1, ground floor)
- Div. department and institute libraries in the main building (Salzburg, Mirabellplatz 1)
- Library of the Orff Institute for Music and Dance Education (Salzburg, Frohnburgweg 55)
- Library of the Institute for Play Research (Salzburg, Schwarzstraße 24)
- Library of the Department of Music Education in Innsbruck (House of Music, Universitätsstraße 1, 5th floor)

The holdings of the main library are divided into the open access holdings, which can be accessed in the reading room and are arranged systematically, and the magazine stock. Magazine stock must be ordered online. The open access holdings of the main library, journals, theses and the holdings of the rare books collection (published before 1875) cannot be borrowed and can only be used in the reading room. At the department libraries, the holdings are offered in open access.

Borrowings

The desired books, sheet music etc. can be ordered via the homepage of the University Library:

The ordered titles are usually available at the circulation desk within one hour.

Students of Mozarteum University Salzburg can borrow 20 information carriers at the same time. An exception is made for diploma and dissertation students: They can borrow up to 30 titles.

University Library Salzburg (Universitätsbibliothek Salzburg, UBS)

The UBS (www.plus.ac.at/universitaetsbibliothek/) is the largest academic library in the city and province of Salzburg and is also accessible to students of Mozarteum University. Those who do not also study at the University of Salzburg (PLUS) and therefore have the appropriate student card, however, require a library account and their own library card for borrowing.

• Instrument lending

In order to borrow an instrument at the Department of Business and Procurement of Mozarteum University Salzburg (Schranngasse 10a, 2nd floor, 8.30–11.30 a.m.) or in Innsbruck (secretariat), the following steps are necessary:

1. fill in the loan form (available at the relevant secretariats and at the Department of Business and Procurement) and conclude a loan contract
2. obtain a positive opinion from the head of the class or the head of the department
3. conclusion of an insurance
4. presentation of all the above-mentioned documents as well as the student ID card

Before returning the instruments, please note: For violins, violas, violoncellos, a confirmation from Geigenbau Svatek (Salzburg, Paris-Lodron-Straße 5) must be submitted. For all other instruments (e.g. double basses, wind instruments and percussion), confirmation from the head of the class is required.

• Rental of digital equipment

• Cloakroom boxes / lockers

If you haven't found a place in a hall of residence or don't want to live there in the first place, the best place to find a place to stay, apart from the relevant advertisement pages of the Salzburg News, is the flat exchange (**Wohnungsbörsen**) of the ÖH Mozarteum (<https://oeh-mozarteum.at/wohnborse/>) and the ÖH Salzburg (<https://boersen.oeh-salzburg.at/boersen/wohnungsboerse/>). As the offers change several times a day, it is advisable to visit them frequently.

New in Salzburg? Register your residence!

Within the first three days after their arrival in Salzburg, all students must register at the registration office of the city of Salzburg. This also applies to Austrian students who move to Salzburg for the first time and establish their secondary residence here.

The necessary registration form can be downloaded or obtained from the landlord or the hall of residence. When registering in person, please bring the registration form signed by the landlord and your passport.



Residence regulations for international students

Registration certificate for EU/CH/EEA students

Students from EU/EEA countries or Switzerland who stay in Austria for longer than three months need a registration certificate in addition to the registration form. For this purpose, the student must prove the following:

- admission to a recognised educational institution (confirmation of enrolment from MOZonline)
- comprehensive health insurance cover (e.g. European Health Insurance Card, insurance policy, ...)
- sufficient means of subsistence (declaration of financial means such as Erasmus scholarship, financing by parents, etc.).

The certificate costs € 15,- once and is permanently valid. Those who cannot provide this proof must expect a fine of € 250,- in the event of a police check.

Responsible for this registration is the Magistrat Salzburg, Amt für öffentliche Ordnung, Schwarzstraße 44. When applying, in addition to the fully completed form, you must bring a valid passport or identity card with a copy and the registration form.

• Sport offers for students

The **USI** offers a wide range of sports activities for students, university staff and external people. 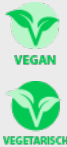

• Public transport

The „KlimaTicket Salzburg“ as network ticket for the entire public transport in the province of Salzburg

When and where is the “KlimaTicket Salzburg” valid?

- network ticket for the entire province of Salzburg
- valid on all public transport: trolleybus, bus, and train
- bicycle transport on local trains is included in the ticket

How much does the “KlimaTicket Salzburg” cost?

- the “KlimaTicket Salzburg CLASSIC” is available for € 365,- per year
- payment once per year or in 12 instalments
- discounted offers for different groups of people



Which discounts are possible for students?

“KlimaTicket Salzburg U26” for € 274,- per year

- 365 days of public transport use
- the age on the day the ticket becomes valid is decisive

“KlimaTicket Salzburg SEMESTER” for € 150,- per semester

- semester ticket as a network ticket for students under 26 years of age (everyone who is 25 years or younger on 1.9. of the academic year)
- valid from 1.3.–31.8. (summer semester)
or 1.9.–28.2. (winter semester)
- requirements: being enrolled as a regular student at a university in Austria; the place of study or place of residence must be in the province of Salzburg
- students who are enrolled to an extraordinary course (e.g. postgraduate course) are unfortunately not eligible

• Opening a bank account for students in Austria

What is a student bank account?

- A student bank account is a giro account for students with special conditions.

What are the requirements for a student bank account?

- You have to be a student and prove your current status regularly, e.g. with a certificate of enrolment
- You must have reached a certain age (check the age limits at the respective banks)

What documents do I need to take with me to open a student bank account?

- Valid passport or identity card
- Valid student ID
- Certificate of enrolment or confirmation of studies

For foreign students, to be on the safe side (varies from bank to bank), you should also take with you:

- Registration confirmation/registration certificate for current place of residence
- If necessary – residence permit

The Course and Examination Management (also known as 'Studienabteilung') is part of the study administration and is responsible for numerous services for prospective and current students. It is primarily responsible for:

- Information and counselling for students and prospective students
- Processing and contact point for the artistic entrance examinations
- Admission/registration of domestic and foreign applicants for regular, extraordinary and ERASMUS studies.
- Change of studies, co-enrolment, deregistration and resumption of studies, change of lecturers
- Student ID card (first issue and duplicates in case of loss or theft)
- Issuing confirmations
- Examination management for students of teacher training
- Issuing graduation certificates and notifications
- Academic ceremonies: graduations and doctorates
- Waiving and refunding of tuition fees
- Application for scholarships
- Counselling and admission to the university entrance authorisation examination
- Nostrification of foreign studies and academic degrees
- Counselling at study information fairs

Teaching Management (Lehrmanagement, LM) – lehrmanagement@moz.ac.at

Its core tasks include

- Teaching administration (ordinary studies, university courses, postgraduate university courses)
- Teaching assignments and entrustment with teaching
- study and university law
- Appointments and habilitations

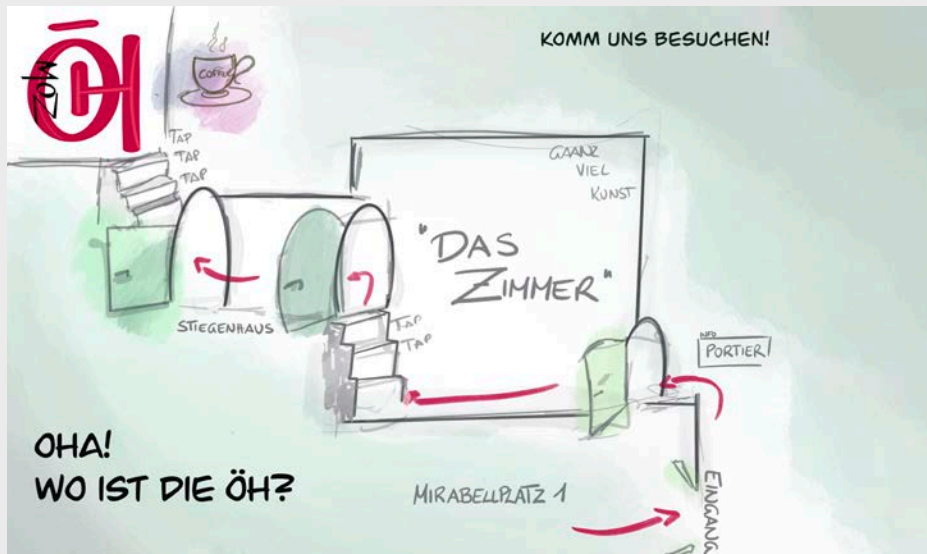

The Director of Studies is responsible for study law matters, such as:
